Goldback Fern	<i>Pentagramma triangularis</i>	* common wetland obligate plant found in unusual habitat. Where found?

Western Sword Fern	<i>Polystichum munitum</i>	* found in Feb. 2008; ID by Janet Gawthrop.
Bracken Fern	<i>Pteridium aquilinum</i>	* well established populations in areas with open canopy
